INFORMATION FOR INTENDING PARTICIPANTS

The Northern Territory Government has **multiple purpose taxi licences available in Alice Springs and Darwin**. The Government has decided that the licences will be allocated through a strictly administered ballot.

How does the Ballot work?

The ballot draw, to allocate the available multiple purpose taxi licences, will be conducted as a random draw. Each ballot application is pre-numbered. All application numbers will be entered into the random draw. A record will be kept of the numbers drawn and the order in which they are drawn. Multiple purpose taxi licences will be offered according to the order of the numbers drawn.

The random draw will be made in a manner similar to the televised lotto draws: numbered balls tumbled in a barrel and them drawn at random, one by one, until all have been listed.

Each taxi area will constitute a separate random draw.

Each applicant will be able to apply for a multiple purpose taxi licence in one taxi area only (Alice Springs or Darwin).

Applicants can request appropriate ballot papers from the Commercial Passenger Vehicle Branch of the Department of Planning and Infrastructure, by telephoning **(08) 8924 7580**.

1. ELIGIBILITY

The ballot for available multiple purpose taxi licences is open to individuals or entities that have current accreditation as Commercial Passenger Vehicle (CPV) operators, in accordance with *Part 3* of the *Commercial Passenger (Road) Transport Act*, to operate CPVs in the Northern Territory of Australia.

2. LODGEMENT OF APPLICATIONS

All applications to participate in the ballot(s) for the available multiple purpose taxi licences shall be on the form titled: *Ballot for the Allocation of Multiple Purpose Taxi Licences*.

All fields on the application form **must be completed in full**. Incomplete or non-conforming responses will be considered ineligible. Ballot papers, which contain alterations or deletions or are not clear and legible, may be excluded from the ballot process.

Applications delivered by hand/courier/post must be in a sealed envelope, marked with the unique Ballot Number (see 2.1) and the closing date of **11 August 2006**, followed by the address.

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Each application must be on a separate sheet.

Verbal or electronic lodgements will not be considered.

Applications will be used for this one ballot date only. Applications submitted for this ballot will not be carried forward to future ballots.

2.1 Ballot Number

Ballot draws are identified with a unique number:-

0806/ASPMPT for a multiple purpose taxi licence in **Alice Springs**

0806/DRWMPT for a multiple purpose taxi licence in **Darwin**

The ballot number must be included as the first line of the address (see 2.3 and 2.4 below), when lodging an application.

2.2 Closing Time and Date

Applications will close at **2pm Central Standard Time on Friday, 11 August 2006.**

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2.5 Late applications

Applications received after the stated closing time and date **will not be accepted**.

3. APPLICANTS TO INFORM THEMSELVES

Applicants shall inform themselves fully of all conditions related to submitting an application, and the legislative and regulatory requirements for operating a multiple purpose taxi licence in the Northern Territory, including the availability, purchase and fit-out of appropriate vehicles.

4. ALLOCATION OF MULTIPLE PURPOSE TAXI LICENCES

The ballot will be a random draw and will take place in the week following the close of applications. All applications will be listed beside their drawn position.

The random draw will be held at 11am on Thursday 17 August 2006. Interested persons are invited to attend the random draw to be conducted on Level 2, in the NT Archives Meeting Room, at 25 Cavenagh Street, Darwin.

Successful applicants will be advised by telephone, and mail, of the offer to take up a multiple purpose taxi licence. The offer is open to acceptance for a period of fourteen (14) days from the date of the mailed advice and must be in writing. The offer is not transferable by the applicant. It may be accepted or declined.

Unsuccessful applicants will be advised by mail.

All applicants will be advised within one calendar month of the closing date, allowing sufficient time for all first-round offers to be processed.

4.1 Offer Accepted

Applicants, who accept the offer of a multiple purpose taxi licence will pay all licence fees, vehicle purchase, fit-out and registration costs, and all taxes, fees and charges related to the on-going operation of that licence and must abide by the requirements of legislation in the Northern Territory. A licence will only be issued in the name of an applicant drawn in the ballot.

Applicants should be aware that the annual licence costs of the multiple purpose taxi licences, which are being offered through this ballot, are:-

- 0806/ASPMPT \$6 500 each for a multiple purpose taxi licence in Alice Springs;
- 0806/DRWMPT \$8 000 each for a multiple purpose taxi licence in Darwin.

Licence fees are to be paid in advance for the first 12 months and then a quarterly payment option is available.

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The Government expects that successful applicants will have their vehicles registered as multiple purpose taxis within the following timeframe from the ballot draw date:-

- twelve (12) weeks.

No requests for extensions to this timeframe will be accepted.

Failure to comply with the timeframe may mean that an offer is withdrawn and the next listed applicant from the same licence draw will be offered the licence.

4.2 Offer declined

Subsequently, if an offer to take up a multiple purpose taxi licence is declined, the licence will be offered to the next listed applicant from the same licence ballot draw.

4.3 Change of licence category not permitted

A multiple purpose taxi licence cannot be converted to a standard taxi licence.

4.4 No advantage to a particular CPV operator

Current policy requires that taxi network terms and conditions do not give an advantage to any particular CPV operator regarding the ability to apply to participate in a ballot or accept an offer of a licence.

5. INSUFFICIENT APPLICANTS

If the number of applicants in either of the ballot draws is less than the number of licences available, the remaining licences will carry forward to the next ballot date.

7. LICENCES BECOMING AVAILABLE BETWEEN BALLOT DATES

All available taxi licences will be offered at a ballot at least annually.
